Fellowships provide support for scholars, researchers, and specialists to pursue research on all aspects of the relationship between, and interactions among, democratic governance and those parts of society that are neither government nor business.

Program: Visiting faculty pursue their own research programs, conduct lectures, and contribute to the intellectual life of the Center, the Department of Government and the Georgetown Public Policy Institute. Fellows are expected to participate in CDATS activities and to give a public presentation on the research they carry out while in residence. In addition, fellows are required to teach one graduate-level seminar during the term of the fellowship. All visiting faculty receive a competitive stipend and applicable Georgetown University benefits.

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
